

The Four Types of Essays

1. The Expository Essay (explanation)

- Describes or explains a topic.
- ❖ For example, an essay entitled "The Care and Maintenance of a Bicycle" would be an expository essay

2. The Narrative Essay (recounting)

- Uses a single well told story as the basis for drawing a conclusion or making a statement of opinion.
- For example "My Most Exciting Bicycle Adventure" would be a narrative essay.

3. The Argumentative/Persuasive Essay

- Presents a reasoned series of arguments in support of a position.
- ❖ For example, an essay entitled "Cars or Scooters: Which is the Most Effective Method of Transportation?" would be an argumentative essay.

4. The Descriptive Essay

- More than many other types of essays, descriptive essays strive to create a deeply involved and vivid experience for the reader.
- Great descriptive essays achieve this affect not through facts and statistics but by using detailed observations and descriptions.
- For example, an essay entitled "My Grandfather" would be a descriptive essay.
